Exploration that are cross-listed, students can register for any prefix as long as it does not share a prefix wit a course in their major. Several majors are exempt from this rule as outlined under the Exploration Cluster section.

LLS courses can be counted towards majors, minors, and certificates. LLS courses can count for up to three skills. Therefore, some classes fulfill more than one skill.

EXPLORATION CLUSTERS

Students are required to successfully complete <u>TWO</u> approved upper-level courses within the Exploration Course list. For students who have declared a single major, Exploration courses <u>cannot be used to satisfy major requirements</u>. However, students who have declared more than one major can apply the upper-level Exploration courses to satisfy requirements for one of their majors. Approved Exploration courses can be applied toward completion of a student's minor(s) or certificate(s).
